Roles of Women in Reform Movements



- By the last quarter of the 19th century, many middle class women had received considerable education. Even with newfound educational independence, society still viewed women as nurturers and agents of stability.
 - Women used this influence and their educational attainment to advocate for social change.
 - These reforms included a re-born temperance movement, women's suffrage, sanitation, educational reforms, and attacks on racism.



Jane Addams & the Settlement House Movement



Hull House Settlement, Chicago

- ☐ Women such as Jane Addams, played a huge role in improving the lives of the urban poor, especially immigrant women and children who were forced by circumstances to work and live in dangerous and unhealthy conditions.
- ☐ Addams was the founder of the Settlement House Movement in the United States.
 - The Settlement House Movement began in urban England as a way of helping the poor by securing donations from the wealthy in an effort to improve the lives of the destitute.
 - Jane Addams decided to create a similar settlement house in Chicago after visiting Toynbee House in London, England.
