HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS

People around the world developed a new sense of commonality based on language, religion, social customs, and territory. This was sometimes harnessed by governments to foster a sense of unity.

A variety of internal and external factors contribute to state formation, expansion, and decline. Governments maintain order through a variety of administrative institutions, policies, and procedures, and governments obtain, retain, and exercise power in different ways and for different purposes.

HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS

KC-5.3.III.B

Colonial subjects in the Americas led a series of rebellions inspired by democratic ideals. The American Revolution, and its successful establishment of a republic, the United States of America, was a model and inspiration for a number of the revolutions that followed. The American Revolution, the Haitian Revolution, and the Latin American independence movements facilitated the emergence of independent states in the Americas.

KC-5.3.I.B

The ideas of Enlightenment philosophers, as reflected in revolutionary documents—including the American Declaration of Independence during the American Revolution, the French "Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen" during the French Revolution, and Bolívar's "Letter from Jamaica" on the eve of the Latin American revolutions—influenced resistance to existing political authority, often in pursuit of independence and democratic ideals.

Newly imagined national communities often linked this new national identity with borders of the state, and in some cases, nationalists challenged boundaries or sought unification of fragmented regions.










BRINTON COMPARES POLITICAL REVOLUTIONS TO THE COURSE OF A FEVER.











1. INCUBATION

This stage in an illness is when the <u>cause</u> of the sickness first comes into contact with the individual, <u>infecting</u> them, but not yet causing any symptoms to present themselves.

2. FEVER

This stage in when sickness starts to affect the person in observable ways. Temperature may rise. A cough may present itself. The individual might

The individual might become weak, or tired.

3. CRISIS

This is the critical stage of an illness where two things can happen. The person either breaks the fever & get better or they get worse and never recover.

4. CONVALESCENCE

This stage involves recovering from the illness. The individual might be weakened from the experience, but they eventually emerge healthy & able to prevent future illness.








THE BASTILLE




- BUILT TO DEFEND PARIS DURING 100 YEARS WAR IN 1357
- SYMBOL OF MONARCHICAL DESPOTIC OPPRESSION

JULY 14, 1789: THE THIRD ESTATE NEEDS GUNPOWDER STORMING THE BASTILLE




- ROYAL ARMORY (GUNPOWDER)

- TORN DOWN (BRIDGE)




- 1. MEN ARE BORN & REMAIN FREE & EQUAL IN RIGHTS
- 2. THE AIM OF ALL POLITICAL ASSOCIATION IS THE PRESERVATION OF THE NATURAL AND THE RIGHTS OF MAN. THESE RIGHTS ARE LIBERTY, PROPERTY, SECURITY, & RESISTANCE TO OPPRESSION.
- 3. THE PRINCIPLE OF ALL SOVEREIGNTY RESIDES IN THE NATION. NO BODY NOR INDIVIDUAL MAY EXERCISE ANY AUTHORITY WHICH DOES NOT PROCEED DIRECTLY FROM THE NATION
- 6. NO PERSON SHALL BE ACCUSED, ARRESTED, OR IMPRISONED EXCEPT IN THE CASES AND ACCORDING TO THE FORMS PRESCRIBED BY LAW
 7. THE LAW SHALL PROVIDE FOR SUCH PUNISHMENTS ONLY AS ARE STRICTLY AND OBVIOUSLY
- 7. THE LAW SHALL PROVIDE FOR SUCH PUNISHMENTS ONLY AS ARE STRICTLY AND OBVIOUSLY NECESSARY, & NO ONE SHALL SUFFER PUNISHMENT EXCEPT IT BE LEGALLY INFLICTED IN VIRTUE OF A LAW PASSED
- 8. AS ALL PERSONS ARE HELD INNOCENT UNTIL THEY SHALL HAVE BEEN DECLARED GUILTY...
- 9. NO ONE SHALL BE DISQUIETED ON ACCOUNT OF HIS OPINIONS, INCLUDING HIS RELIGIOUS VIEWS, PROVIDED THEIR MANIFESTATION DOES NOT DISTURB THE PUBLIC ORDER ESTABLISHED BY LAW.


 10. THE SECURITY OF THE RIGHTS OF MAN AND OF THE CITIZEN REQUIRES PUBLIC MILITARY FORCES. THESE FORCES ARE, THEREFORE, ESTABLISHED FOR THE GOOD OF ALL AND NOT FOR THE PERSONAL ADVANTAGE OF THOSE TO WHOM THEY SHALL BE ENTRUSTED

FEUDALISM BANNED

- **AUGUST 4. 1789**
- NAT'L ASSEMBLY **OFFICIALLY REMOVED** 1ST/2ND ESTATE **PRIVELAGES**



CATHOLICISM BANNED

- LANDS CONFISCATED
- STATUES/CROSSES **DESTROYED**
- REPLACED WITH THE CHURCH OF REASON

REVOL. CALENDAR

- **USED FROM 1793-1805**
- 10 DAY WEEKS
- **DECIMILIZE FRANCE**
- REMOVE REL/ROYAL INFLUE

SANS-CULOTTES

- **CULOTTES=KNEE PANTS**
- SANS=WITHOUT
- **MOSTLY URBAN WORKERS** WERE SANS-CULOTTES
- PEOPLE DRESSED TO MATCH THESE LEADERS OF THE FRENCH REVOLUTION

WON

- PRIOR TO REVOLUTION, WOMEN WERE "PASSIVE"
 - RELIED ON MEN TO **DETERMINE WHAT WAS BEST FOR THEM**

WOMEN PLAYED KEY ROLES

- MARCH: MURDER OF MARAT
- OLYMPE DE GOUGES -WROTE DECL OF RI. OF WOMAN
 - **GUILLOTINED IN 1793**






FROM 1792-1815, FRANCE WAS NEARLY CONTINUOSLY AT WAR
